# JUNE'S BIRTHSTONE AND GEMSTONE

## **Alexandrite**

Alexandrite is a variety of chrysoberyl. It was discovered in Russia in 1833 and named for Tsar Alexander II. The third hardest mineral and the most expensive. It is both rare and unique among minerals. Uniqueness is largely due to its light induced color changes. The darkest is found in Zimbabwe.

The most famous and best comes from the Tokovaya River valley in the Urals. Russian alexandrite specimens are displayed in the Mineralogical Museum of the Academy of Science in Moscow. The largest alexandrite, 66 carats, was found in Sri Lanka and is on display at the Smithsonian Institution.

Chemical Formula: Al<sub>2</sub>BeO<sub>4</sub> Crystal Habit: Orthorhombic

Color: Emerald green in daylight red-violet in artificial lighting, various shades of green, violet, magenta, yellow to smoky brown depending on light source

Lustre: Vitreous, transparent to translucent, appears greasy on cleavage face

Cleavage: Incomplete or conchoidal

fractures

Streak: Colorless Moh's Hardness: 8.5 Specific Gravity: 3.7

Soluble In: Hydrofluoric Acid slightly; perchloric-nitric/4 acid solution is used to detect beryllium

Characteristics: Brittle, strong pleochroism, intergrowth common with tripling, often occurs as twins; it should resemble spinel's structure due to similar formulas but it takes on olivine's structure

Environments: Global occurrence associated with pegmatites and course-grained granites, especially mica schist

Major Localities: Ural Mountains in Russia, Sri Lanka, Brazil and Zimbabwe

Virginia Localities: Alexandrite is not known to be found in Virginia nor is chrysoberyl.

International Gemstones: Unakite
