Stereoscopic Photography in Mineralogy by Boris Staroska

We review stereo-3d images on several devices and in several formats, and demonstrate simple methods to get you started making your own. Learn to create a visual record that captures and reveals semi-transparency, inclusions and other internal structures, reflectivity and sparkle in your mineral or gemstone collection.
