MT. ATHOS QUARRY FIELD TRIP



Our start to a beautiful day began eight in the morning at Mt Athos quarry. Waiting for us to arrive was Jack McCarthy the Area Manager for Boxley Materials. Jack is a pleasure to talk to and is an all around great guy. With everyone there on site, we began our safety brief for the dig. We spoke of the high walls, berms and various hazards to look out for including some potential wildlife like danger noodles AKA (snakes). After we gathered everyone and buddied up for carpooling we started into the mouth of the quarry.

The guarry was active that day so we had to stay clear of all of the equipment and follow Jack down the side that was out of the way. It was quite a scene as we drove down with all of the cars in line and the view around us was prodigious. As we reached the collection site located near the bottom of the quarry we got the view of the host material. Mt Athos quarry is absolutely wonderful and plentiful in a variety of minerals. Every Rock Tells a Story

Pedlar Formation SJ Boylan

In Bulletin 74, by author Brown, year 1958, the quadrangle map identifies the Pedlar formation as granodiorite, hypersthene and blue quartz. The following is from the internet and other sources.

The Pedlar formation is named after the Pedlar River in Amherst County, Virginia.

Granodiorite is a plutonic igneous rock, formed directly from molten rock cooled slowly. Granodiorite has an intermediate in composition between diorite and granite. It has a higher quartz content than diorite, and a higher mafic mineral content than granite. Mafic minerals have a higher amount magnesium and iron,

The name hypersthene has apparently been replaced by the name orthopyroxene. Orthopyroxene is a mineral found in igneous rocks and metamorphic rocks. The chemical formula for orthopyroxene is (Mg,Fe)SiO3.

The figures show granodiorite and hypersthene pictures from the internet.

Try these questions. What is the Pedlar formation named after? Pedlar River. What type of rock is granodiorite? Plutonic igneous. What is the chemical formula for orthopyroxene? (Mg,Fe)SiO3.
