Every Rock Tells a Story


Candler Formation SJ Boylan

Candlers Mountain can easily be seen east and southeast of Lynchburg, Virginia. Candlers mountain is named after Daniel Candler who settled in the area in the 1760s. In Bulletin 74, year 1958, Brown identifies the Candler formation as schists, garnet-mica, and many other rocks.

Schists is a metamorphic rock showing schistosity. Schistosity is a rock texture that can be easily split into plates. Garnet is a mineral and a group of aluminum silicates. Mica is a mineral, and a rock and a group. Mica is sheet silicate. A silicate contains a silicon atom surrounded by four oxygen atoms in a tetrahedral structure. In sheet silicates, the silicate tetrahedral shares three oxygen atoms with adjacent silicates to form a sheet structure.

Figure one shows a picture of Candler Mountain in Bulletin 74. Figures two and three show a rock face on the lower part of Candler Mountain. Figures four and five show a rock face on the top of Candlers Mountain.

Try these test questions. Name two rocks in the Candler formation. Answer. schist and garnetmica. Define schistosity. Answer - rock texture that can be easily split into plates. Describe sheet silicate. Answer - The silicate tetrahedral shares three oxygen atoms with adjacent silicates to form a sheet structure.
