Vasily Konovalenko is a sculptor who worked with stone. Gem Stones. His exhibit, Gem Carvings of Russian Folk Life, uses stone to create art in a way I have never experienced. It is housed at the Museum of Nature and Science in Denver.

Every piece told a story with incredible detail and depth. Konovalenko's story is as interesting as his work. I encourage you all to look at his work if you are drawn to these pieces.

Every Rock Tells a Story - Polymorphs of Kyanite

In Bulletin 74, by author W. R. Brown, year 1958, the map of the Lynchburg quadrangle indicates Reusens migmatite in the upper left corner. Reusen migmatite is identified as dark diorite hornblende gneiss.

<u>Migmatite</u> is a rock formed by regional metamorphism at more extreme conditions than gneiss. High temperature and high pressure partially melts rock to form migmatite. Migmatite is characterized as banded gneiss and an igneous rock. <u>Diorite</u> is a rock. Diorite is a phaneritic plutonic rock formed by slow deep cooling and crystallization of magma. Plutonic rocks form from magma. Phaneritic rock is an igneous rock in which all the minerals can be seen by the unaided eye. <u>Hornblende</u> is a mineral. Hornblende is inosilicates silica tetrahedral linked in a chain group. Inosilicates are chain silicates in which the silica tetrahedrons are joined together to form a chain. Hornblende is part of the amphiboles group of rock forming minerals. <u>Gneiss</u> is a metamorphic rock. The pictures are taken from Wikipedia.
