Club Officers will meet in January to update/revise Bylaws and scholarships.



## **Every Rock Tells a Story – Catoctin Formation**

In Bulletin 74, by author W. R. Brown, year 1958, the map of the Lynchburg quadrangle shows Catoctin greenstone formation on the eastern side of the map.

The Catoctin greenstone formation is named after the Catoctin mountain ridge in Maryland. The Catoctin mountain ridge is north "west" of Baltimore and Washington. Camp David is located in this region. Camp David is the retreat for presidents. Catoctin refers to a local Indian tribe name.

The Catoctin greenstone formation overlies the Lynchburg formation and underlies the Candler formation. The Catoctin greenstone formation is placed in the late Precambrian group. The Cambrian period in geological time started 570 million years ago. Therefore the rocks of the Catoctin greenstone formation are over 570 million years old.

The Catoctin greenstone formation is Catoctin greenstone layers interlayered with Meta sedimentary layers. Catoctin greenstone is a metamorphic rock. Basalt has been identified as a protolith for greenstone. Catoctin greenstone is dark green, fine grained schist and gneiss. Catoctin greenstone may contain the minerals <u>biotite</u>, <u>epidote</u>, <u>chlorite</u> and <u>amphibole</u> minerals.

The following is from the Audubon Guide to Rocks. <u>Biotite</u> 533 is a mineral with a dark color and small crystals. Biotite is a phyllosilicate. A phyllosilicate is a sheet silicate with three oxygen atoms shared of each silica tetrahedron. <u>Chlorite</u> 535 is a mineral group name. Chlorite is also a phyllosilicate with a color of light to dark green. <u>Epidote</u> 571 is a mineral in the sorosilicate category. Sorosilicates have two silicon oxygen tetrahedrons linked by sharing one oxygen atom. Epidote has yellowish green sometimes referred to as pistachio color. <u>Amphibole</u> is a group of minerals.537 The pictures are taken from Wikipedia.
