# **Every Rock Tells a Story- Blackwater Creek Trail Diagram**

In Bulletin 74, by author W. R. Brown, 1958, the map of the Lynchburg quadrangle shows a railroad track running alongside Blackwater Creek in Lynchburg Virginia. Figure One shows a diagram of the trail represented as a straight line. The diagram shows the trail from the Ed Page entrance to the railroad bridges. The distance is about 2 miles. This section of the trail is characterized by cuts and fills. There are ten cuts and ten fills. The fills are between the cuts, The original topography is ripples. The cuts and fills were made to provide a smooth path for the railroad tracks. Figure two shows two closeup views from cut 1.

Figure One - Blackwater Creek Trail Diagram




Figure Two - Closeup Views from Cut 1
