James Tomlin, Holly Tomlin, Debbie Wade, Carl Pilat, Joan Moore, Steve Boylan, Thom Noble and Linda Noble. Steve Gordon attended via speaker phone

Members not present:

Eric Routon

The Executive Board:

- Decided to gracefully cut ties with Parks and Rec
- Voted 9-0 against doing an outdoor event in Amherst in March
- Voted 9-0 in favor of replacing the motor on the 16” saw
- Voted 9-0 in favor of purchasing new pumps for the sluice
- Voted 6-3 in favor of having the sluice at the July show as long as the Moose lodge approves it
- Agreed on table prices for our July show to be as follows: **For GMSL members-**\$20 for 1 table or \$30 for 2 tables with option for power for up to 4 tables for a fee of \$10. **For non GMSL members-** \$30 for 1 table or \$50 for 2 tables with option for power for up to 4 tables for a fee of \$10
- Agreed to have the pickers wheel at the July show
- Agreed to purchase the raffle specimen from Dave Callahan’s collection again this year
- Agreed to have Carl Pilat create a field trip survey for club members to get feedback
- Agreed to get more details on insurance for both south eastern and eastern federations and discuss before choosing which one we will go with
- Voted 9-0 in favor of changing the following items in the bylaws:
 - 1-Update the club dues to coincide with our new pricing
 - 2-Update the date and location of club meetings to coincide with our new day and location
 - 3-Remove our agreement with parks and rec from the bylaws

4-Update scholarship rules to say the only way to be entered into the drawing is by volunteering. 1 ticket per person, per day for a minimum 4 hours of work at club sanctioned events (shows and workshops when items are made for shows)

- Agreed to come up with a workshop schedule for creating specific items for shows
- Agreed to promote workshops in the newsletter
- Agreed to purchase signs to be used at shows
- Agreed to further discuss the idea of doing a yearly rockhound of the year award. The winner would be nominated and chosen by the board
- Agreed to purchase 1 table and more chairs for workshops
- Agreed that Steve Boylan would contact Thomas Hale to get speakers for meetings as suggested by James Tomlin
- Discussed possibly doing a craft night with gem trees for a meeting
